▼ SITUATION

The year 2024 was the hottest ever recorded, with the global average temperature temporarily exceeding +1.5 °C compared to the pre-industrial era. This increase was accompanied by an intensification of extreme weather events: devastating wildfires in Canada, California, and Greece; unprecedented flooding in Kenya, Brazil, and Europe; typhoons of unprecedented magnitude in Asia; and record marine temperatures in the Mediterranean (source: lemonde.fr). According to the World Meteorological Organization, the decade from 2015 to 2024 is the hottest ever recorded, with accelerated glacier melt, sea level rise, and ocean warming.



REFLECTION

COP30, scheduled from November 10 to 21, 2025, in Belém, Brazil, will be a crucial milestone for strengthening global climate commitments. It aims to provide an effective and credible response to the global climate crisis, integrating climate justice, scientific urgency, just transition, and systemic transformation.
